



1 – Gold


2 – Brown

Reining is a western riding competition for horses where the riders guide their horses through certain patterns of circles, spins and stops. There are five things that are different in these pictures. Can you find them?







- a heavy flat top block with pointed end used for hammering and shaping horseshoes
- 14. headpiece to which bit, straps and reins are attached
- 15. necessary piece of head gear for cowboys and cowgirls



American Quarter Horses are known for their versatility. Versatility means their ability to be used for many different things. One thing Quarter Horses can do is compete in jumping classes.





Rodeo events like barrel racing, test the speed and agility of the horse. A timed event, barrel racing is especially popular among cowboys and cowgirls.

THE NEXT BEST THING: THE MOP PONY

Mop ponies are great class activities and can be as simple or complex as you would like to make them. The mop ponies we have for our trail rides at the American Quarter Horse Hall of Fame have fabric strip bridles and large wiggly eyes, but you can choose to leave those details off if you want just construct a simple horse.

Look for mops at local dollar stores. They are inexpensive and make great ponies.

Follow the directions below to make your own:


MATERIALS:

- Mop (cheap)
- 4 strong rubber bands
- Twine, leather or fabric strips, or yarn for bridle and reins
- Optional Wiggle eyes
- Hot glue gun



STEP 1:

Take 1/3 of mop



STEP 2:

Fold and place rubber bands to creat face

STEPS:

- 1. Gather up mop strings in your hand. The first 1/3 of the mop head will be folded under and rubber banded close to the stick (throat area of the horse) to make the length of the head.
- 2. A second rubber band will wrapped around the nose.
- 3. To make ears, pull up three mop strings for each ear, braid or twist, fold over, and rubber band close to the head.
- 4. Use yarn, twine, or fabric strips to creat a bridle.

The teacher can hot glue this in place. If you opt for the wiggle eyes, teacher can hot glue those in place too.

Now, get out there and ride!



STEP 3:

From each side. take three strands and braid



Take braids separately and fold for desired ear size and place rubber band to hold





For final touch place brown yarn to create bridle as shown in picture

SNACKS TO ENJOY ON YOUR NEXT TRAIL RIDE!

EASY JET NO BAKE COOKIES

- ullet 1/2 cup peanut butter or sunbutter for peanut allergies
- ¾ cup powdered sugar
- 1/4 cup of milk
- 1 cup Quaker Oats (quick or old fashioned uncooked)
- 3/4 cup unsweetened puffed wheat or granola
- 1/4 cup apple chips crunched into small pieces
- First measure out ingredients into a large bowl. Combine peanut butter, sugar, and milk; mix well. Stir in oats and remaining ingredients.
- Then drop by rounded teaspoonful's on waxed paper. Let stand until firm. Store in tightly covered container.

FEED PAN TRAIL MIX

- 2 cups Corn Chex
- 2 cups Rice Chex
- 2 cups Wheat Chex
- 1 cup pretzel stickes
- 1 cup unsalted peanuts
- 1 cup M&M candies
- Directions Toss ingredients in a clean, lined small feed pan or bucket and serve! For extra nibbles, serve with sliced apples and carrot sticks.
